

Clapham School will partner with local businesses to provide students with excellent internship opportunities. Internships seek to develop professional skills and to cultivate awareness of vocational calling.




PARTNERSHIPS

COLLEGE GUIDANCE



College guidance at Clapham School begins with the student in mind. The starting place is a student finding their calling and mission in life. Only then does the question of where to go to college make sense.

Each student meets with the Academic Dean once per year beginning their Freshman year, and then every semester starting their Junior year. They build a roadmap to college that maximizes their opportunities to cultivate their calling and mission.
